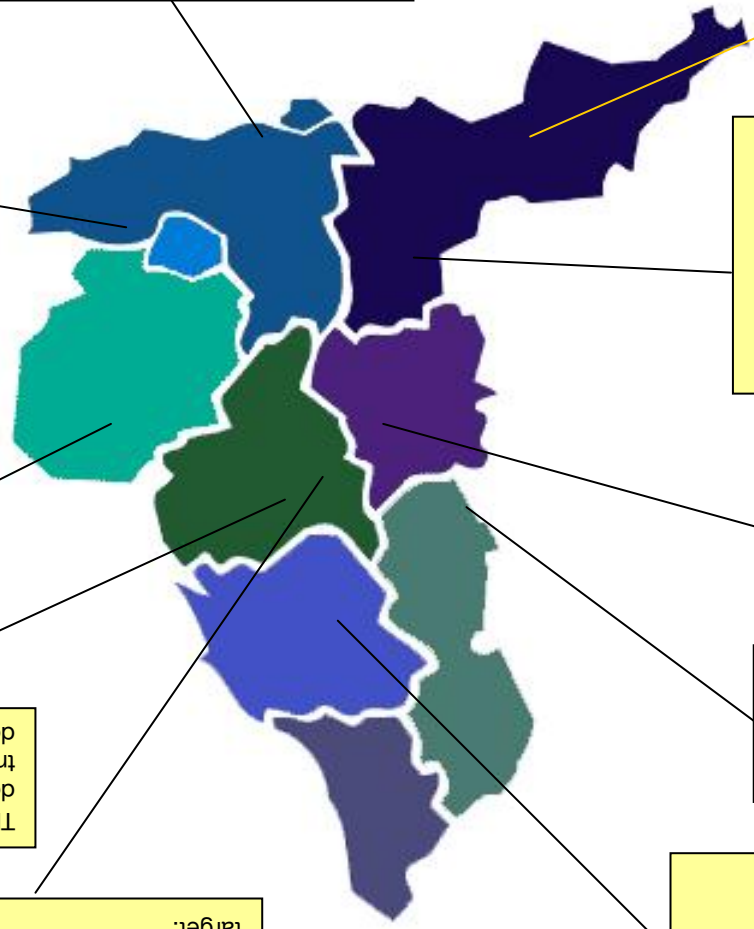
## The Compact in your area

# The Compact and NIT around England



In **Wakefield**, the Compact Group has the responsibility for the development of the third sector strategy for the district. This allows partners at an operational level to contribute directly to NIT whilst ensuring compact compliance.

**Blackpool's** decisions by public bodies and partnerships are Compact-proofed so that everything they do follows their Compact. They work out together how decisions will affect the local community.

**Wolverhampton** Compact will be used to measure progress towards a local thriving sector.

"Taking over the delivery of NIT gave our Compact Group a useful new focus, helping it to be more strategic and better linked into the county Local Strategic Partnership. It became obvious that NIT objectives were about implementing the Compact and all the relevant partners were already round the table." *Jess Mace, Manager of the Gloucestershire VCS*

In **Devon** the LSP recognises NIT as the Local Compact indicator and the Compact is being used to measure progress towards a thriving local sector.

**Derby** are using the shared vision of a thriving sector in their Compact to achieve their NIT target.

The **Nottinghamshire** NIT delivery plan has a Compact development track throughout, including a Compact training program and the Compact-proofing of documents.

"Our recipe for success comes from knowing a Thriving Sector and our Compact are two sides of the same coin. The Norfolk Compact will be used to reference our thriving sector plan while partnerships and public bodies check their decisions with our Compact." *Dennis Mawson, Norfolk Compact Officer.*

**West Sussex** Compact Implementation Group is leading on – and officially the responsible partnership for – the county's NIT work. They have a Compact worker and all processes are approved by the voluntary sector forum.
